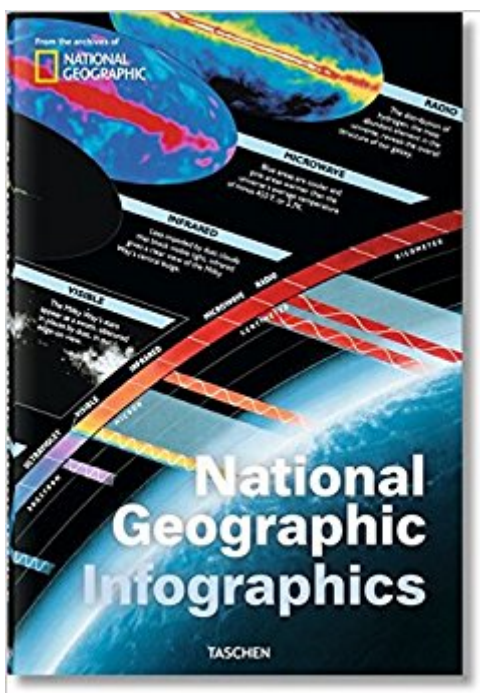

Fantastic book, and it’s huge! I just received my copy late last week, so I haven’t read through this cover-to-cover yet, but I’m very pleased so far. This book is much larger than I had expected at about 10" x 15", making it almost double the size of the magazine. I think this would make a great gift for anyone who is interested in information design, graphic design, or enthusiastic about National Geographic. As a design nerd, it’s interesting to see the evolution of design style over time, and see a variety of ways to convey information visually. Being so large and a hardcover, the book is rather hefty. I’d be interested in picking up a second copy in softcover, if it were a bit smaller. I think it would make for a very handy reference book for anyone who works in design.

Though expensive this book is a rare explosion of brilliantly conceived information in a book that you will want to read and look at over and over again. It is a piece of art and reference for learning and knowing. I hope it is the beginning of a way to communicate important facts and understandings for publications yet to come.
