

From the short blurb in the Wall Street Journal that alerted me to this book, I expected a somewhat humorous list of topics, like a dictionary, with a short entry for each. But instead it is a more serious investigation of several aspects of Danish life, such as education, cuisine, design, politics, immigration, television, etc. It is by a British writer and discusses TV programs that are not available in the U.S.and quotes prices in their British pound equivalents and uses British words (I had to look up what ramsons were). I felt that the food and design chapters went on too long, but overall it was very interesting and informative.

I enjoyed Patrick Kingsley's thoroughness and choice of topics. especially the chapters on Danish education, the New Nordic cuisine, Muslim citizens' issues, and the welfare state.
