The book includes both Visayan and Tagalog. It is sectioned into different categories to make it easy to study what you want. I highly recommend this to anyone wanting to learn Visayan because there is not much available for referencing that, most books or study aids only cover Tagalog which is the national language.

I bought this book because I was making a trip to Cebu to visit my fiancee and her family. I found the contents of this book to be very complete and it assisted me immensely in communicating well with her family and the locals when I was commuting around the city. This is very useful as a guide to learning the language, as a phrasebook, and as an English to Cebuano/Cebuano to English dictionary. I was able to quickly and easily translate between languages and make constructive communication with the locals in the Philippines. I strongly recommend this to anyone who is planning on visiting or moving to the central Visayas.
