

This was a great addition to the series. I felt that Keliah finally came together for me as a character. Redemption and second chances are a big theme in these books. I wasn't sure about the concept at first, because it appeared to be a repeat of Super Villain Dad, but it turned out to be a great story in its own right. Love, love, love, the extra stories at the end of each book, especially those about the adults as they are not the main characters of the books. I feel like we have not seen some of my favorite characters for a while - Liz and Ken and Jeanie. I know you have a huge roster, so just hoping they show up more in the future. Love Skye, of course, and want to see her "thang" with Century develop, but really want to see Liz and Taurus get ahead as well. These books are for people that want to be entertained with amusing, clever characters that don't have a dark, disturbing underbelly. There is drama, and what I feel are great plots, but these are not dark books full of angst and street realism (which is what I like about them!). So refreshing to just be able to read a book that is really well written without feeling depressed while I am reading them. The author is incredibly creative and has written an alternate reality that I have escaped to over and over, a world that makes me HAPPY. I laugh I cry, I feel good. I wish I was one of her characters going to Cape High, and while I am reading them I am there, at least for a while. Thank you Ms. Ross. I really connected with this book, how she pulled in some peripheral characters as Falconess family line while still pulling in most of the other kids for short portions of the story. For me Carla stole the stage every time she was on the page with her genuine belief in those that deserve it and how protective she is. Plus gotta love the name of Hypersonic Rainbow for a superhero though she has a shortened name that I will not say here.

considering how long this super series has been running it still has some of the same charm and light heartedness as it began with while addressing some real family generational issues and serious crime and punishment being implemented in a society of supers in a darker manner than many people may realise than if they stop and think about the series. Many of the characters are either orphans or outcasts being brought into something between an orphanage and a boarding school due to their parents either abandoning them, being killed in action or locked up for crimes against humanity. Many of the children have been preyed upon by kidnapers, serial killers, and child

predators thru-out the books. Really its kind of amazing the series is as light hearted as it is. This particular book continues in several of these points as Nico and the other adults try to reform the super criminal justice system in the midst of a super criminal breakout. Meanwhile three generations of one of the iconic superheroine's lineage in this world must resolve who one of the villains is to them, a husband, a father, a grandfather, or a fugitive that must be brought to justice and locked up forever.

A new story following the previous mold, enjoyable as always. Family makes bad guys good and the super teens, with a little help from their prince of pal's Nico, take out a few new baddies - with the addition of the power blocker to their arsenal the takedowns are a little less dramatic, but the characters are still fun. While nominally a "Falconess" storyline we get a little look at what it was like for Nico in the supercells and a better understanding of what he went through back then (and with who.) As always, decent. Like your favorite TV show or the like, enjoyable, characters you like to see, probably won't win any oscars... but I'll keep tuning in for each new release! Thank you for something I can count on for escapism and a happy ending!

But it is not actually taking place for the most part at Cape High. The student is the daughter of Falconess. Her mother drops her off on her family's secret island. You learn more about how the family actually got their powers, you learn about a super villain who escaped from the Cape Cells, and why he wound up there. It fleshes out some of the history of what happened and why he was a super villain. The path he walks leads to him finding redemption in a way, and the ending of another villain. But that is only the roughest bits of what happens. The telling of what happens makes it a great read.

As everyone should know nothing is perfect. This book while a great read is something the author should be proud of, but I would like her to always improve. Lots of people who only read this one book out of all her works would probably see only a fluff piece. It's not. It's about the one thing that always should be the most important out of everything. Family. Please keep writing.
