The text encourages critical thinking while challenging the students' ability to express themselves in Spanish by providing them with an opportunity for in-depth exploration of relevant contemporary issues. The Fourth Edition presents four main themes around which all the text and supplemental materials revolve: Espacios: Publicos y privados, Encuentros y desencuentros, Patria/Nacion: Acercamientos, and De acÃfÂ; para allÃfÂ;. Each thematic unit is supported by creative activities and engaging authentic materials. Both Spain and Latin American countries are represented, as are male and female writers, and a few of the different ethnic groups that comprise Hispanic culture.

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MÃ Âª Victoria Garcia Serrano (Conquista de la Sierra, Spain) studied Hispanic Philology-Linguistics at the Universidad Complutense de Madrid. She received her PhD in Contemporary Latin American Literature from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Her areas of research are literary theory and writing by Hispanic women authors. Cristina de la Torre was born in Cuba and moved to the United States as a child. She received her undergraduate degree from the University of Miami, Florida, and her Ph.D. in Spanish from Emory University. She spent several years in Madrid, Spain, where she was inspired to begin her dual career as professor of Spanish and literary translator. Annette Grant Cash teaches Spanish at Georgia State University where she is also the Director of the Translation and Interpretation Program. Her BA and MA degrees are in Spanish from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and her PhD is in Romance Linguistics from The Ohio State University.

This is one of the better textbooks I've encountered in my Spanish education career. The textbook format includes questions, 3 stories per chapter, and discussion topics. The stories involved both teaches Spanish and informs the student about Spanish culture, issues like immigration, and basic human emotions that we can relate to. The workbook contains grammar and questions for each chapter, and it's organized to both introduce new grammar and review old ones. It's also cheaper to buy the two together rather than separately! This is a great book for any Spanish student. The Spanish class at JHU is using this one for its advanced class, but it's structured so that a beginner with no Spanish background can pick it up at Chapter 1 and master it by Chapter 12.

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
