

Effective and very twisty thriller. Told from multiple points of view, alternating between present and past, this novel offers a gripping story. Toni's daughter, Evie, is abducted from her school one afternoon when Toni is caught in hopelessly snarled traffic, and as the press excoriates Toni for her neglectful parenting, the police make no progress in finding her. Moving forward 3 years to the present time, we meet a woman who is believed to be in a coma after having a stroke, but who is instead suffering from locked-in syndrome. The hospital doesn't know who the woman is, but she's been there for years. We don't know who she is either, we just know that she's paralyzed but totally aware and that she is desperate to find Evie. Very intriguing, with lots of possible suspects and

many surprises.

(2 very mild spoilers)I was lured in by other reviews promising an amazing plot twist that I wouldn't see coming. Except I did see it coming. With the exception of a couple of smaller details, I knew who the "bad guy" was long before the reveal. It doesn't take much imagination to line up the list of possible suspects and then go about eliminating them, especially when the author is using misdirection like a bludgeoning tool. Blink is not a bad book. Its just not the page-turner I was lead to believe it would be. I did like the use of the stroke victim as story telling tool. I thought that piece was imaginative and created most of the tension. I also felt that Toni's "dirty little secret" (so called as to not spoil the plot) gave the book a sort of gaslighting quality that I appreciated. I felt that it could have been wielded a bit more, actually. But the rest of the story is really fairly common mystery/thriller trope wrapped around a couple of good concepts.I read it in 4 hours and wish I had checked to see if the library had it before paying for it. It was only \$2.99 but still, while not a "bad" book exactly, I would rather have spent that money on something that left me in awe of the story line or the writer's deft use of language. In this case, I spent .75 cents/hour on something I had figured out myself by the halfway point.

Blink begins in the present time but quickly goes back 3 years to pickup events in a young mother's life after the upheaval of losing her husband. Besides the stress of that tragedy, she now must leave the home she can no longer afford, find a job, raise her daughter with only the dubious help of her critical mother, deal with some suspicious occurrences around her new residence, and contend with some sketchy neighbors and a hostile coworker. In the face of this challenging situation, she develops some other problems that make life difficult. The story weaves back and forth between the present and the past as it builds the story and sense of mystery and suspense. I found the story well told and very compelling even though the multitude of negative circumstances affecting this young woman does get rather oppressive at times. Once you finish this read, I think you will agree it is in the spirit of Hitchcock and "The Sixth Sense" with how it builds to its climax.

If, like me, you read a lot of "mystery" novels, and pride yourself on usually figuring out the ending within the first few chapters, then I encourage you to read "Blink". If you follow the bread crumbs, like I did, you will be certain to have a good idea of what happened, and the "who", if not the "why", of the crime. Well, not so fast Sherlock. As you near the end of the book, one major assumption is dashed by a very casual comment. I actually went back and re-read the comment to make sure that

I hadn't misunderstood. Now there's a whole new mystery to add to the plot. But you're not finished yet. As the tangled knot begins to unravel, yet another twist is revealed, information to which the reader has been previously exposed, but allowed to ignore as irrelevant to solving the original crime. Bread crumbs can lead you right over the cliff. And there are at least a couple of other red herrings thrown in for good measure.Not only is this novel well-written, but it's artfully crafted from beginning to end. Highly recommended.

Sorry, but this just didn't seem to fire.I thought the back and forth perspective of the characters was interesting but the characters themselves were not. A twist works better when it's better intertwined with the story developing.It wasn't a bad idea but the execution could have been better. It was a shame because it didn't start out too badly.

The ending seemed rushed. I was kind of disappointed. It passed time for me though and kept me following- it was just like oh that is what happened.. Kind of saw it coming.

I love it when I finish a book and immediately look for more from the same author. I think that says more about a book than anything.

This was one of those books that grabs you in with sympathetic and real characters right from the start. The main character is the mother of a five year old who is struggling with the death of her husband from injuries in Afghanistan. He made a bad decision and led another soldier to his death. She struggles to build a new life but at times uses her dead husband's sedatives-not a good way to start a new life. She has very few people in her life after moving to a new area to be closer to her mother. Her daughter disappears, her drug use is discovered and she is suspected and blamed even by strangers. I guessed every person in this book to be the kidnapper...well all except the actual kidnapper. I love it when that happens and it makes sense. Many twist and turns in this well written book. I highly recommend it to anyone who likes mysteries, good fiction and not much violence
