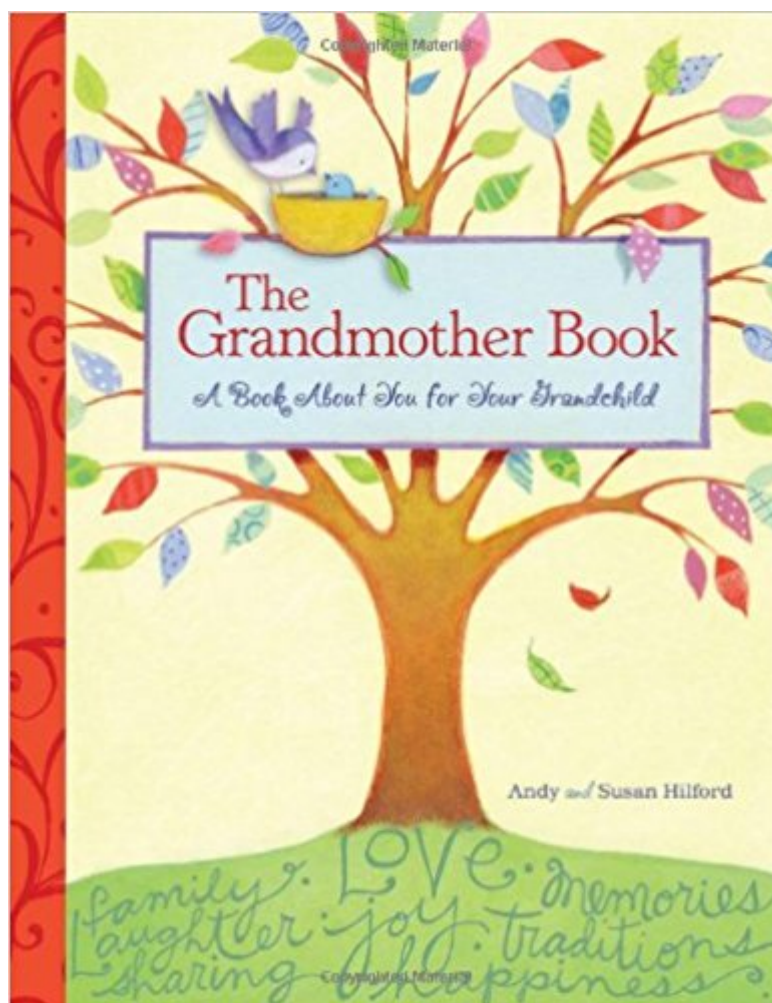

I originally purchased both because without being able to browse through them before purchasing, I didn't know which one would be better. The one by Susan Branch is amazing and exactly what I was looking for!!!

The pages only take a ball point or permanent pen, which is complaint #1. But my real complaint is that some of the questions were worded in such a way that, while it would've been easy to make this inclusive of step parents or adoptive parents, it's just not. You can do better designing this yourself online and ordering it to fit the needs of your family.

I ordered three of these little "family history recorders". One for each of my Grandchildren. Again, I am thrilled to have such a book to fill in the blanks and give as a "record of history" to my Grandchildren. Whata super idea! I was surprised as I was filling out the first one as to how many old memories came to mind for me to share. I am 70-yrs.-old, and would give anything if my dear Grandmother's had left something like this for me. I have such good memories of both of my Grandmothers; however, to be able to have something in their own handwriting would be wonderful.

This book is so cute! Definitely more for "traditional" grandmas who have been married, but if you read in the front it clearly says you can change anything... and that's all the more personal! My mom was thrilled to get this.

The details elicited in this book are unimportant and I would have to research on line to find answers to prices of things and events in a particular year. really would have liked more pages to write stories and not just fill in the blanks. Can't imagine a grandchild the least bit interested in what my

favorite movies were, where grandpa and I first kissed, etc. this was not what I expected and don't know how to make it work for my grandson. Perhaps typing up stories and attaching them to the pages with some photos but the book, as designed, is not what I expected

I am very close with my grandma and have heard her favorite stories various times. The book prompts have inspired so many other stories that I have never heard before. We complete the pages together, one section each time that I visit and it's a great bonding experience. I like the format because of 1) fun prompts and room for short, simple responses (so it feels less like homework) 2) pages for photos throughout the book 3) thin, hardcover, large style. It doesn't have rings, but I didn't have difficulty writing in it. There isn't anything that I dislike about it at this point, but she thought some of the titles were strange like "Grandpa studmuffin" but I thought they were funny & lighthearted. This book is great for my grandma who remembers specific details like her childhood address, the make and price of her first car. I also bought the "Memories for My Grandchild: A Keepsake to Remember". It is also a cute book but here are the features that I didn't like: 1) it seems more like homework... there is a prompt and a large space for a response. I wanted more of a light hearted conversation with my grandma. 2) less room for photos & memorabilia. 3) size... it is small and wide. I preferred the thin and tall style. However, I ended up gifting it to my mother. She preferred "Memories for My Grandchild: A Keepsake to Remember" because she enjoys creative writing and there are prompts with lots of space to write freely, instead of remembering specific facts/details.
