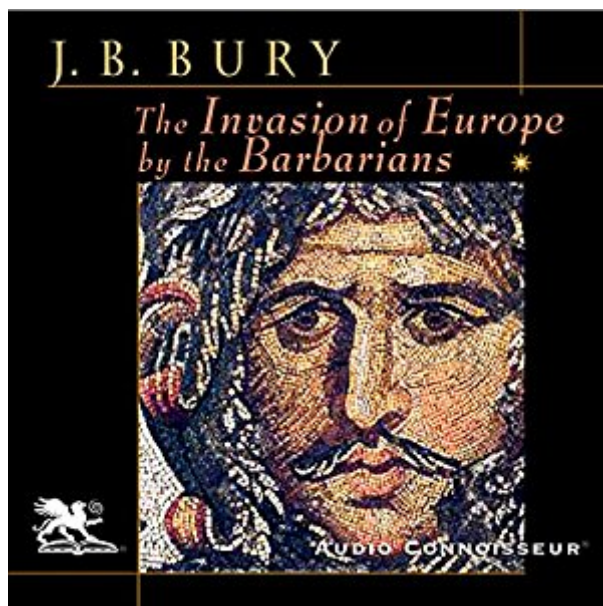

This is actually a series of well knit lectures on the late Roman Empire's wars, and other interactions, with the German Barbarians. Many of the latter were actually admitted into the Empire when the various groups of peoples caused problems for, or attained ascendancy over, the Romans. This is a short book, and not covering everything (for example, the Vandal Kingdom in North Africa), but what it does cover, it does so well and succinctly. Professor Bury also does not describe the evolution of early medieval France (Merovingian France), but one can attain this

elsewhere. Further, the book does to a degree assume some general knowledge of the times, and is therefore not quite for the beginner. A book for an upper class history course in College, therefore. Well done.

Excellent coverage with appropriate repetition to remind the reader of successive rulers of each barbarian race to show the big picture of how barbarians influenced the dominion of various nations and empires. It's an enigma of when the Roman Empire actually ended. This can be answered various ways as author Bury points out. The downside of the book is the complex description of family intermarriages which distract and detract from the thematic flow which is the book's prime asset in capturing the reader's interest.
