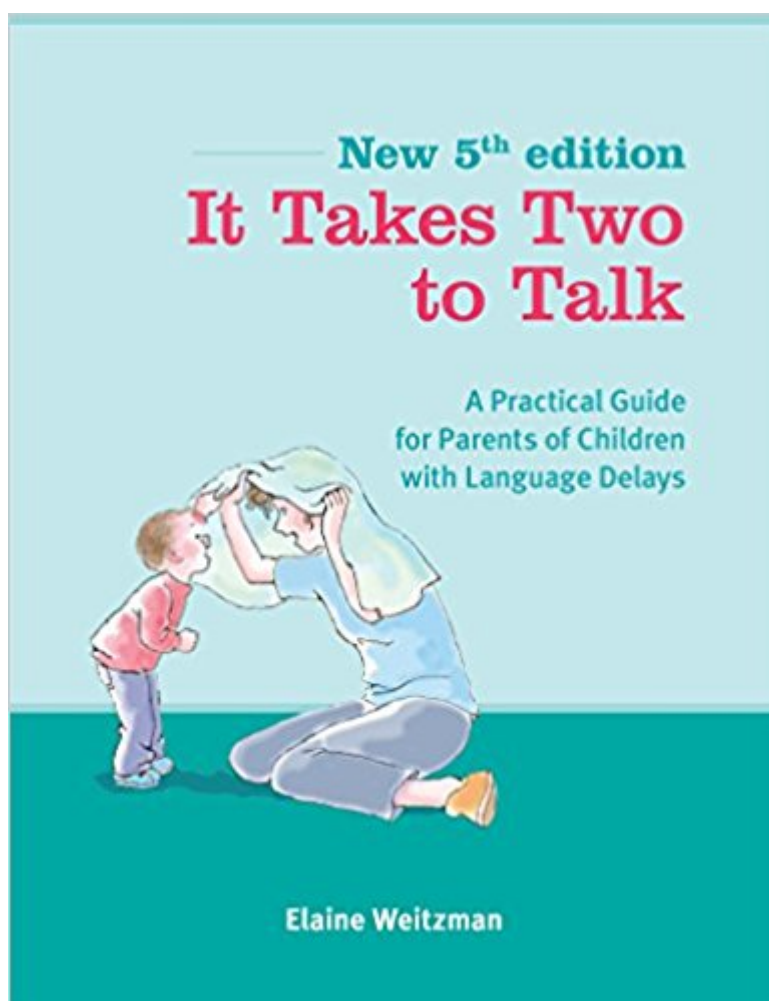


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# It Takes Two To Talk: A Practical Guide For Parents Of Children With Language Delays
