

Synopsis

The surprisingly hopeful story of how a straight, nonpromiscuous, everyday girl contracted HIV and how she manages to stay upbeat, inspired, and more positive about life than ever beforeAt nineteen years of age, Marvelyn Brown was lying in a stark white hospital bed at Tennessee Christian Medical Center, feeling hopeless. A former top track and basketball athlete, she was in the best shape of her life, but she was battling a sudden illness in the intensive care unit. Doctors had no idea what was going on. It never occurred to Brown that she might be HIV positive. Having unprotected sex with her Prince Charming had set into swift motion a set of circumstances that not only landed her in the fight of her life, but also alienated her from her community. The Naked Truth is an inspirational memoir that shares how an everyday teen refused to give up on herself, even as others would forsake her. More, it's a cautionary tale that every parent, guidance counselor, and young adult should read.

The book is candid and resonates with what is happening in Kenya right now. Divorce rates, teens and young adults sexually active at an early age, many of us pretending HIV & AIDS are for "others", etc. I am going to share this book with my 18yr old daughter currently in college, as soon as is possible.

She also speaks about the manner in which her diagnosis and treatment was handled by medical professionals.

I would have liked it better if she began talking about HIV sooner because the first half of the book is just one messy blur in my mind.
