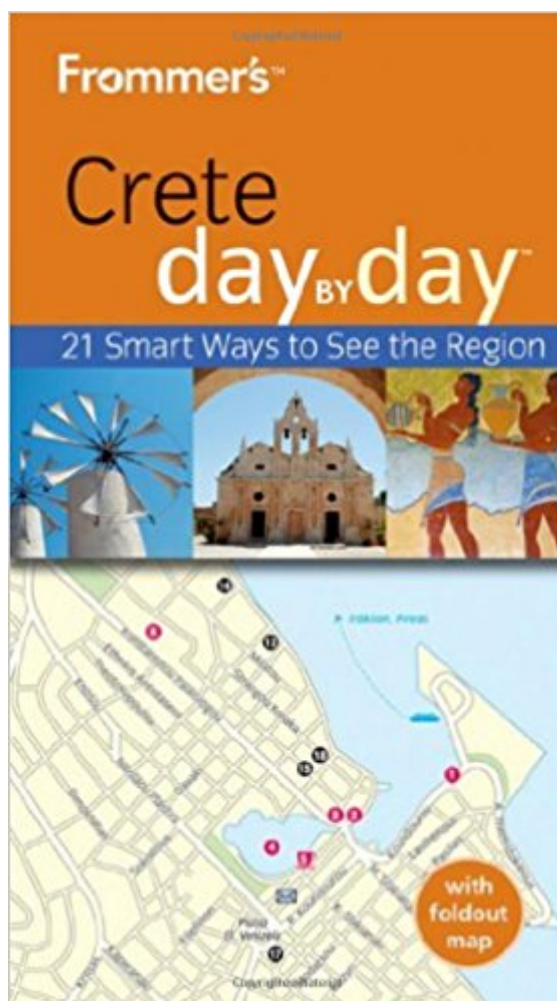

There are walking trips, driving tours and suggestions based on whether you have one day up to two weeks. I found that helpful because it's impossible to decide what's really the most important. We really enjoyed the suggestion to take the ship to a few of the more secluded beaches. Other people at the resort mentioned how terrible the drive/walk to Balos was and how they wished that they had just paid for the sail. We took the guide's advice and enjoyed cocktails and a relaxing sail to the best beach in the world. The history wasn't overloaded either. Some of our guidebooks seemed more like a history lesson than a practical tourist's evaluation. Plus, I don't like to ruin the tour by reading long explanations beforehand.
