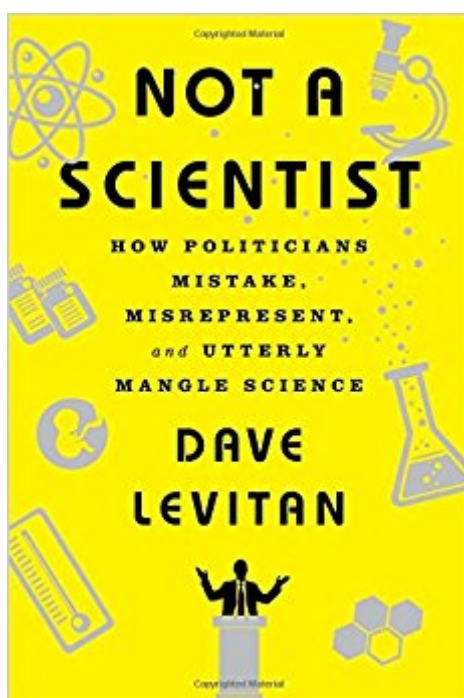

scientific findings, from human health to renewable energy. It's not the first book to do that, of course. But it is one of the most accessible I've read.
