

As a Christian home educator, I found this to be an excellent resource! It's like having a conversation with someone who has thoroughly researched the topic, but loves the Lord (Yahweh), and offers wonderful insights into events. His language is simple enough that my fourth or fifth grader can easily follow it. In fact, I assign books for my children to read independently, and then simply discuss their thoughts afterward. What I found is that the author's comments capture what I would already hope to say to my child. It does a nice job of defining terms, provoking thought, sectioning out the information into bite-sized chunks, and includes pictures and maps to illustrate what is being discussed. More importantly, it avoids the tendency by many modern historical-revisionist books to portray either side (native peoples or Spaniards) as all good or all bad. It presents them as they were, but with notes that draw out how the Bible might speak to the topic or actions. I highly recommend!

I thought that this book was a good overview of these three civilizations. The content is interesting, and the book includes comprehension questions to aid in further discussion with my children. Their favourite parts were learning about why human sacrifices were made, as well discovering what achievements made the Mayans more technologically advanced than the Incans and Aztecs. The book is written from a Biblical perspective, so there are Scriptural references.MY RATING: 4 stars!! It was very good, and I recommend it as a good complement to your studies of these civilizations!
