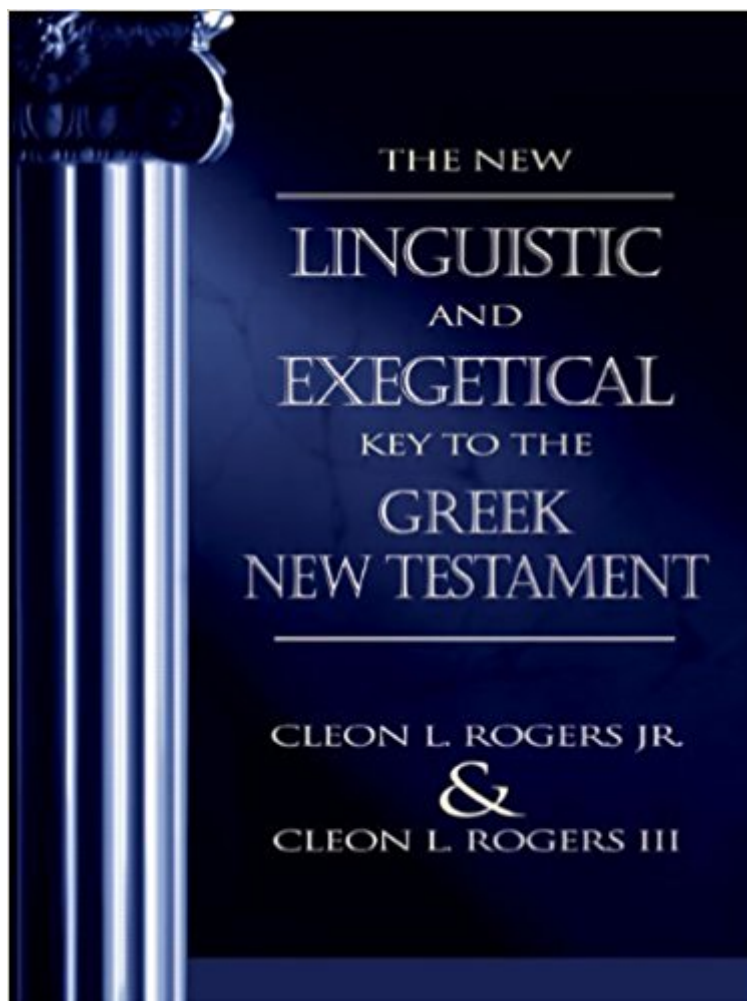

This revised and expanded edition broadens the scope of the earlier editions still further, to the extent that it stands now as a distinct, new work, fully geared toward English-speaking students. Building upon the content of the first English translation, The New Linguistic and Exegetical Key to the Greek New Testament goes beyond word forms to address grammatical and exegetical issues as well. It takes a proven study tool to the next level, equipping Greek students with a verse-by-verse analysis of unusual forms and grammatical and exegetical difficulties for the entire New Testament.

Purchased this as a gift for a pastor friend. He had briefly looked at the original book (20 years ago) but had never used it. After a few weeks using this source for studying the Greek text, he was wondering how he'd survived without it! Whether your Greek is healthy or arthritic, this is the tool to have.

Great linguistics tool for GNT. Unfortunately the authors bias for verse meaning shines through to point where it's hard to ignore.

I have only begun to use this tool, but so far I am very impressed. As a 2nd year seminary student, I've used numerous grammatical, lexical, exegetical tools and this one is becoming my go to. It is not exhaustive, but for the kind of translation and exegetical work that I am doing, it is excellent.

This book is very helpful when reading NT Greek. It parses verbs and gives commentary on the way. The comments are particularly helpful in explaining idioms, as well as suggesting the use of a word in the sentence (e.g., not just saying that it is genitive, but suggesting "genitive of relationship"). I use it almost daily in my studies and lesson preparation.

I use this primarily as a help for reading through the GNT. Along with a basic lexicon or dictionary, this book will help others like myself who have a basic understanding, but not yet a mastery of Koine Greek, to read or do exegesis in the NT with greater facility and accuracy. The parsing/grammatical information along with some lexical data offers enough help to keep me reading with understanding, but not so much information so as to bog me down with exhaustive studies on each word or grammatical construction.

This book provides the parsing for each verb in each passage of the New Testament. It is incredibly helpful. Such a great tool for biblical studies.
