

My New Favorite ResourceOver the last three years, I've been adding native plants to my garden. I've read lots of books with mixed results: many seem to expect the garden to be very large and don't give the kind of information I was looking for. This book fills those needs and more! Each plant description gives helpful details such as growth pattern (aggressive, clumping), light or heavy reseeding, soil type, even specific pollinator details - not every time, but often enough to help me determine which species would work in a particular situation. Although there are no charts for each habitat, the information is in the text, and I've been able to come up with my own lists for prairie, savanna and woodland. This will enable me to come up with plant communities that suit specific areas of my garden. The author writes as from a gardener's perspective as well as an educator, and his insights are very helpful.One other tool I've been using is the Biota of North America website. I can pinpoint the plant's range down to my county and those surrounding. Using this book and the website will help me make the best combination of natives for my local pollinators.
